The words "Feed my sheep" (John 21:17) were declared by Jesus to His disciple Peter. In keeping with our Lord's instructions, we offer the following... Spiritual feeding is to be "Christ-like" - i.e. in our daily lives we should

- 1. Say yes to God and no to the flesh (the natural person).
- 2. Die-to-self daily (try to let go of our bad habits) in compliance with our Lord's teachings.
- 3. God must increase and we must decrease in all aspects of our lives. God wants us to apply His wise counsel in our daily lives wherever we trod. He has promised to equip us in carrying out His will for us to grow in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ as we are being transformed (molded) into His image.

Worshipping God our Father in church on Sundays amongst the fellowship of others is important. Jesus teaches that "For where two or three gather together in My name, I will be there among them" and He further states "Do not forsake the assembling of ourselves together."

However, our understanding is that implementing Jesus' methods is the most important part of our Christian life-style.

God is love and Jesus is the incarnate and expressed manifestation in whom all things consist.

Agape love is what Jesus did for us on the Cross. It is the he love of humanity. It is self sacrificial love. It is the love Jesus asks of Peter in the opening Scripture verse. It is discipleship - Calvary love. Paul spends much time in his writings teaching the newly formed churches that we must love each other. Two of his most famous writings are Galatians 5:22 and 1 Corinthians 13:4-7
