Dear Friends,

Over the past few weeks I have been getting to know more about Niagara Falls. Not just the beautiful and plentiful water as it flows through our community, but the community itself. I was amazed to find out that there are over 250 children attending the public school who are homeless. Many of them are sheltered in some of the motels along Niagara Falls Boulevard. The problem will become worse in 2023 as places like Community Mission are no longer able to provide temporary shelter for families with children. The law is changing with the coming of the new year. Families may no longer be mixed with single individuals. While the law is well-meaning in its effort to protect children, the unintended consequence will be more families out on the street.

I spent a couple of hours with Jockline (one of our members) riding through the neighborhoods not far from us. The number of boarded up houses was so discouraging. She pointed out an area the city is hoping to acquire through Eminent Domain to create a new destination park. The city has plans to fund the acquisition of the park property by using federal funds meant to fight poverty. It is an allowable expense under the guidelines, but with so many people in such desperate need, is it a wise investment?

Niagara Falls has faced tough times over the years. The Urban Renewal of the 70s and 80s destroyed much of the character of the downtown neighborhood. Developers have come in with ideas and received public support and then left with a trail of broken promises.

With a new year upon us and as we look forward to our 200th anniversary next year, perhaps we are being called to shine our light in a new direction. Perhaps these crises in our community are an opportunity for us to step forward and use our position to build up our community. We might even consider challenging the status quo and consider how to support our community in becoming a community where everyone's needs are met. When no one wonders where they will sleep this week or next month, where everyone who want to be in school is in school, where people have access to the healthcare they need, where food is accessible and affordable. We cannot do any of this aloe, but we could find partners. We could enlist the people in the effort it takes to build a community where everyone counts.

John Pavlovitz is a pastor and theologian. He wrote a book called "A Bigger Table." Here is a short excerpt from his website:

Friend, the heart of the bigger table is the realization that we don't have to share someone's experience to respect their road. As we move beyond the lazy theology and easy caricatures that seek to remove any gray from people's lives, we can meet them in that grayness, right where they are without demanding that they become something else in order to earn proximity to us or to a God who loves them dearly. Just as was true in the life and ministry of Jesus, real love is not contingent upon alteration, it simply is. There is no earning of fellow ship or deserving of closeness; there is only the invitation itself and the joy that comes when you are fully seen and fully heard.

Maybe this is the year for First Presbyterian to work on building that table and extending it as far as we can see! Blessings to you for 2023.

Big News


Congratulations!
