One person talked about how they found comfort when just sitting near their tree. Another talked about how their sense of the tree changed over a period of months. That they felt a real presence from the tree after having spent time with it every week over an extended period of time.

I have always been kind of skeptical of this kind of talk and connection. Yet, I find myself leaning into these experiences more and more. I committed to completing 52 hikes this year. So far I have completed 22, so I am a little behind. I hope to catch up by early July. I am keeping a journal with photos from each of my hikes. I am also committed to 52 different trails. It has been fun finding out-of-the-way places to go for a walk. And I find I love spending time with the trees. I listen to the birds. I wonder what I am hearing. Sometimes I stop and sit and just listen to the world. The rhythm of nature is everywhere. Part of the class included spending time being grateful. How often do we take time for that? No matter how much we think we do, I am sure we could do much more!

Friends, let's commit to spending time in nature this summer. Let's commit to offering gratitude for all that we have and all that we are, everyday. Who knows how we might be changed? Who knows how our understanding of our place and our role in the world might also change?

First Pres was proud to host the deCycles Saturday June 24 to Monday, June 26. The deCycles is a cross country cycling youth group based in Bloomington, Indiana. When the group arrived at the church on Saturday afternoon, tired and hungry, they were greeted by members of First Pres who served them a pasta dinner. The group attended Sunday worship service at First Pres and gave a small talk on the activities and goals of the group. Sunday afternoon the deCycles toured the Falls.

The deCycles will pedal their bicycles 1500-miles in 23-days from Bloomington, Indiana to the Atlantic Coast in Maine. Most of the riders are new to cycling and have trained to prepare for this trip. They will cycle 600-miles through Indiana, Ohio, and New York along the shorelines of Lake Erie, Lake Ontario, and the St. Lawrence River. The remaining 900-miles will be through New England, Vermont, New Hampshire and all the way to the Atlantic coastline of Maine.




The Office will be closed the week of July 3rd. The Secretary will be on vacation.
