Letters From Route 66 March 2020

Spring was on its way and though Route 66 seemed relatively unchanged thus far, I could sense a certain shifting... or, perhaps, it was only I that was being changed, bit by bit, mile by mile. I was noticing things that had never before captured my attention - the subtle scent of rainsoaked earth, the increasing number of smiles on the faces of passersby, the full church parking lots on weekday evenings, with people bustling from their cars with all manner of dishes in hand (undoubtedly the infamous Lenten potlucks I had heard about). A deep sense of longing suddenly overcame me. I pulled off onto the shoulder of the road (an act that had become a frequent ritual) and began to ponder the implications... "Lent" - a word meaning "Spring," the time of nature's transformation and renewal. "Lent" - derived from the German root "long" for, indeed, the days were growing longer... and so was my sojourn on Route 66. "Lent" - a spiritual journey of 40 days and nights... I had traversed many more days and nights that that on Route 66... and how had I been renewed? How had I been transformed? What had I learned?

Week upon week I had been given opportunity to travel upon another byway - that of the soul moving within something much greater than the demands of daily living which often steered me away from devoted time with God. Roadblocks were also put up by my resistant human nature that preferred "parking" in known spaces, rather than driving deep into the mysterious depths of the immortal, where God's own truth resides... a truth that cannot be denied no matter how uncomfortable its insights might be. As I sat there pondering, the infamous words of Jesus suddenly flashed into my mind: "Whoever desires to come after Me, let them deny themselves. Take up your cross and follow Me." My heart was pierced with the intensity of that call... "Follow Me!" What would the cost be to embark upon a road that could not be navigated until first taking up my cross?

Feeling the tangible weight of that question, I sank deeper into the driver's seat, seeking relief from the overwhelming realization that I didn't know the first thing about carrying a cross... Or did I?

I glanced at the map next to me, noting all the criss-crossed lines that highlighted my rather haphazard travels, and it began to dawn on me that Route 66 was my cross. Through all the lonely miles and seemingly endless hours striving to quell my uneasy soul, I had finally come to a monumental realization - Surely I wasn't the first one to make such a quest... surely, taking up one's cross was the challenge facing every believer who took these words of our Lord seriously... Surely through suffering and deprivation, as well as happiness and abundance, millions of crosses had been carried successfully throughout the history of humankind. It was not an impossible task. Indeed, was this not the very core of the Christian faith - That the cross of Christ stands empty and, because it does, the gates to the Kingdom of God stand open? Has it not been made clear that we are invited to walk through those gates into abundant life, but must first go with a willing spirit to our own Calvary? Have we not been told that, through the power of God's unconditional love, each of us shall gaze upon an empty cross... the cross that we brought there, having followed Christ to a place where heaven and earth meet?

Heaviness turned to elation as I thought further... Jesus was not issuing a request, but was giving a command. Who was I to disobey? He wouldn't issue the order unless it could be carried out. Pick up your cross! Follow Me! Yes sir! I looked around me once more, taking in the vast solitude of the Arizona high desert that lay before me... and, for the first time in as long as I could remember, I felt free.

May the blessedness of this holy season be yours.
