No matter your cause, you are called and equipped with what you need to make a difference in the world. Chances are good that there are others who feel like you do in our community. Listen and look for ways to connect with others. It is in these connections that we begin to build relationships and bring change to our community. If you have ideas or questions, please share them with me. Together we CAN make a difference.

A representative from the Governor's office, state representatives and representatives of Niagara Falls, spoke at the ceremony.


